Stride with **P.R.I.D.E** (Personal Responsibility Involves Daily Effort).

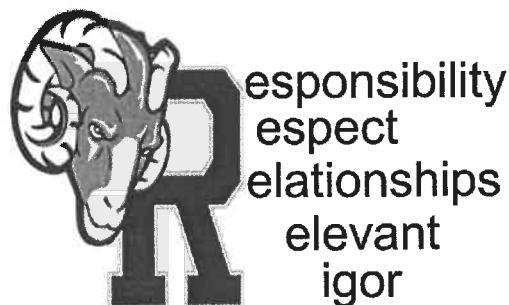
Guidelines for Success:
